EXTREME/RESTED RIFLE HUNTER COMPETITION RULES

Date: 4th Saturday of every month.
Timings: Sign in from 10.00
Start 12.15 for 12.30 start- after briefing.
Results/awards-After completion of the competition.

Attendance at the briefing is obligatory.

All entrants £2.00

The competition is open to all members and visitors.

Classes: PCP, RECOILING - AWARDS TO THIRD PLACE. + GOLDEN SHOT.

Safety

Cease fire will be announced by a single blast of a whistle, Restart by two blasts.

All rifles must be carried unloaded and in a safe manner – muzzle down

Magazines must be removed from the rifle between firing points

Any unannounced discharge at the firing point will count as a shot whether or not there was a pellet in the breech

All discharges to be carried out in a safe manner.

Equipment.

All rifles must conform to legal requirements regarding power of less than 12 fps. Rifles may be chronographed at any time. Any combination of rifle/scope can be used; Range finders may not be used at any time.

Positions

Any safe position may be used. The muzzle must be over the firing line and the trigger behind the line, You must be in contact with the peg when the shot is taken, No part, other than supporting hand to be in front of the firing line. - If not the shot is forfeit, no score gained and the shot may not be re-taken.

Scopes can be adjusted once for distance, magnification and hold-over at each target before putting scope to eye.

Support

Guns may be supported by bipods, tripods, bean bags or boxes etc as long as the support is in front of the trigger guard. Guns may not be supported or rested by any add on equipment that is behind the trigger guard. Single/double point slings maybe used. Stocks shall not be rested on the ground behind the trigger guard.

If naturally occurring support is available (e.g. trees, shooting huts etc) it may be utilized. Where benches are available their use is optional

Targets & Scoring

25 targets in total, Minimum distance of 10yds and a maximum of 65yds.

There could be one or two targets at the peg.

There will be 10 **Red** targets and 15 **Black** targets. The Golden shot will be counted as a red target whatever its colour, The golden shot target will be announced at the briefing and marked on the score card Targets to be shot in numerical order.

Black targets, 2 points for a knockdown, 1 point for a hit, 0 for a miss.

Red targets, 3 points for a knockdown, 1 point for a hit, 0 for a miss.

Total maximum score=60.

Golden shot Target, If knocked over the shooter is eligible to win the “Golden shot” Trophy. If up to three competitors knock it down then there will be a shoot off to decide the winner, on this or another suitable target. If more than three there will be a card draw for the trophy.

Course of fire

One shot to be taken at each target

There is to be no “Practice” shots to be taken at any target before or after your official shot, Failure to follow this rule will incur the loss of that target or the following one whichever counts highest.

Shooting at the wrong target will count as a miss

In the event of a dispute the marshal’s decision is final
